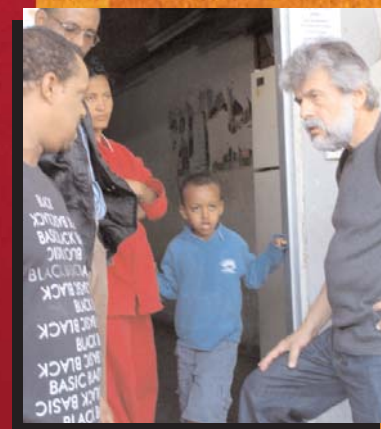


In March 2008, thirty-three John Marshall students traveled to Israel and the West Bank to learn first-hand about human rights issues facing Israelis and Palestinians. Through meetings with scholars, local students, advocacy groups, members of the judiciary and non-governmental organizations, our students developed myriad impressions of this land in search of security, peace and justice. Our students present this exhibition to serve as a catalyst for their experiences, raise awareness of the human struggles they observed and directly benefit one organization that is making a difference in the lives of refugees and asylum-seekers in Israel.



All are invited to share in our personal experiences exploring human rights issues in Israel and the West Bank during Spring Break 2008. Proceeds from the event will benefit the Israeli Aid Organization for Refugees and Asylum-Seekers (ASSAF).

- Since 2006 there has been a constant stream of survivors arriving in Israel from the genocide taking place in Darfur, Sudan as well as asylum-seekers from southern Sudan, Eritrea, Ivory Coast and Congo, who are fleeing religious persecution, enforced conscription, war and violence.
- These refugees and asylum-seekers receive no support from government institutions and are thus left in the hands of volunteer organizations and individuals. ASSAF is one such organization — providing immediate aid for refugees' emergency humanitarian needs as well as psychological support and community building.
